This grant 35 comes with a Federal share of \$968,400 and a local share of \$107,600. In addition, sub-recipient's (the Village) managements costs, not to exceed \$41,000, are included and funded at 100% Federal Share. 36 37 The money from this grant will be used to create a design, permit and prepare a bid package for a full 38 reconstruction of the seawall and adjacent beach. 39 I would like to thank Deputy Mayor Pam Pierce for her herculean effort to create the grant documents 40 and guide the grant through the application process. These grants are very competitive and are 41 extremely difficult to get. If it were not for Pam's hard work and dogged determination it is likely that 42 the Village would not have gotten this grant. 43 In the next few weeks, I will be getting in touch with Town of Huntington Supervisor Ed Smyth to request their assistance in paying for the local share. The Town and the Village have worked cooperatively over 44 45 the last ten years to maintain the seawall. I am hopeful that they will agree to be partners in the funding

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as well.

- 47 Strating on August 6th the Village and Town will work together to do a temporary repair on the wall. This
- 48 project is being funded through a \$50,000 grant that NYS Assemblyman Keith Brown secured for
- 49 Asharoken. I would like to thank Keith for his ongoing efforts to make a seawall replacement a reality.

50 **Trustees:**

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- Deputy Mayor Pierce: Good evening, everyone. During July I worked on the application for the
- 52 \$1,000,000 grant for the seawall repair. I participated in 3 conference calls regarding the seawall with
- Assemblyman Brown and a consulting firm he recommended, as well as GEI for the upcoming sink hole
- repair. Also, I'm in the process of updating our Hazard Mitigation Plan. I reviewed the vouchers, police
- report, the July minutes, and the quote from Harris Corporation for the new tax software.
- Trustee Ettinger: Firstly, I want to publicly congratulate both our Mayor Greg Letica and our Deputy
- 57 Mayor Pam Pierce for all their hard work and on their success in obtaining the \$1,000,000 FEMA Grant
- to fund the design, permitting and bid solicitation for the seawall rehabilitation project. This grant,
- together with the other grant of another \$1,000,000 that we recently received will form the basis for the
- beginning of the rehabilitation of the seawall, that is desperately needed.
- During the past month, as usual, I spent time meeting with Officer-in-Charge Ray Mahdesian on various
- Police related matters and once again, I'm happy to report that we had another good month, that Ray
- will comment on further in his report.

Also, during the month the new Ford Interceptor Police Vehicle, now referred to as A-5, that we received last month, is now a part of our active police car fleet and is performing well. We are currently converting our older police car, A-4, to become the new unmarked police car. We will then begin the process of selling our current unmarked car, the old Ford Crown Vic.

I also want to advise you that our new Part -Time Police Officer Pat Ennis, that was sworn in at last month's BOT Meeting, has been undergoing his initial training during the month and will soon be performing assigned tours later this month.

Some other matters that I was involved in during the month are as follows:

I reviewed correspondence that we received from some of our residents, foils that were received during the past month, last month's BOT Regular Meeting's Minutes and this month's Abstracts for the Payment Vouchers.

Trustee Burke: During the month I reviewed the minutes, abstract, vouchers and police report. I continued to review the correspondence received from many residents regarding the proposed noise ordinance and I would like to thank the residents for their responses. There is a consensus that there is a problem, especially with the landscapers.

Trustee Jablonski: During the month; I reviewed the minutes, vouchers, police report, and various correspondence.

Village Treasurer: Emily Hayes reported for the month of July. The vouchers totaled \$67,077.39. Included in the vouchers this month was a payment of \$13,115.39 to the Village of Northport for Fire tax received from NYS. There will be a separate resolution to approve the vouchers. There were no budget transfers this month. I have set up and reconciled all accounts in Quickbooks. The Village will be using this system going forward.

Attorney Migatz: Planning Board did not meet, the Zoning Board did not meet. The Zoning Board is meeting this month, August 17th, just one case on the agenda. The appeal in the dock litigation was not schedule in June they do not hear arguments in July and August so hopefully in September that will be on the calendar.

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Police Report: Officer Mahdesian reported we had a great month as there was no crime. 44 summonses were issued. The Village Fourth of July celebration was successful.

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Superintendent of Buildings: Doug Adil reported the following: Coordinated foundation wall inspections for 399 Asharoken Ave, inspected a wood deck on the sound side beach lots that appears new but was a repair to an existing structure, inspected footings and foundation walls at 276 Asharoken Ave, reviewed pile installations logs for a new swimming pool at 148 Asharoken Ave, re-reviewed plans for a new home at 238 Asharoken Ave which were approved for a Building Permit, Informed the Village and property owner that there was construction equipment located on a vacant lot on Cove Rd, the equipment was subsequently removed from the site, reviewed the Electrical Inspection report for 160 Asharoken Ave, provided a Letter of Denial for proposed alterations to a home at 3 Bevin Rd. Performed 11 Inspections.
