The Village 31 continues to be on very strong financial footing. The audit stated that "The administration has 32 been diligent in controlling expenses while continuing to provide efficient services to residents." 33 A copy of the audit will be placed on the Village website this week and a copy will also be 34 available for review at Village Hall. 35 During the month I reached out to US Congressman Nick Lalota to see if his office could assist 36 with the Village's request to have the ACOE help with the seawall reconstruction. Senator 37 Lalota's District Director Lauren Lembo contacted the ACOE on behalf of the Village. 38 Subsequently she emailed me with the following, "I checked in with the Army Corps and, as 39 suspected, they informed me "normally HQ will deny a small, locally preferred plan (LPP) 40 because there is too much residual risk. Structures and infrastructure would remain at risk if the 41 protection were focused only on the road. The risk of damages to the road would be reduced, but 42 not as much as it would be with a comprehensive plan." I would like to thank Lauren for getting 43 this answer from ACOE. 44 I received notice today that the PSEG work of installing the underground wire from Bevin Road 45 to North Creek Road is almost done. Starting in mid-January PSEG will begin storm hardening 46 work in the Village and Eaton's Neck. These upgrades include installing stronger poles, creating

- narrow profiles by installing shorter cross arms, upgrading deteriorated equipment and replacing
- current wire with stronger wire. A letter will be sent by PSEG to residents with more details.
- 50 During the month I completed the required Workplace Violence Prevention and Sexual
- 51 Harassment Prevention seminars.
- Santa and Mrs. Claus came to the Village on the afternoon of December 16<sup>th</sup>. As usual it was a

## **Public Hearing:**

Local Law #1-2024 authorizing a property tax levy in excess of the limit established in General Municipal Law §3-c for fiscal year commencing 6/1/2024. Publication was read by Clerk Glennon.

Mayor Letica; reported that the proposed local law (1-2024) to allow the Board of Trustees to 139 override the NY State 2% tax cap. This is the first step in the budget process. The proposed local law 140 (1-2024) gives financial flexibility without the constraints of an arbitrary tax limit imposed by NY 141 State. Passage of this law gives a safety net should unexpected expenses arise, or revenue shortfalls 142 occur prior to finalizing the budget. Examples are unusual high snow removal costs or police 143 overtime incurred due to an unanticipated storm. This is something we've done for the last twelve 144 years. The board is in the very initial phase of preparing the 2024-2025 budget. I want to stress that 145 adoption of the override law should not be interpreted or assumed to mean that the board intends 146 to have a tax increase above the 2% threshold. We must finalize the assessment roll, determine our 147 projected revenues and expenditures, and develop a realistic budget for the next fiscal year. It is in 148 the best interest of the village to adopt the law with the hope and expectation that it may not be 149 needed. Please keep in mind due to the current inflationary environment a tax increase may be 150 needed, fortunately inflation is moderating. Since I was elected mayor 12 years ago our average 151 annual tax increase has been less than 1% and there has only been one tax increase in the last 8 152 years. The village has a long history of financial conservatism and the Board and I will do our best 153 to develop a budget that maintains the level of services for the residents this next year. 154
